PROGRAM OVERVIEW



Students enrolled in the Networking Specialist program will learn the concepts, principles, and techniques required in computer information processing. After successfully

completing the course, graduates will be able to install, inspect, secure and troubleshoot networked computers within an organization. In the work force, they might operate a help desk, provide physical duties or monitor for internal and external threats. Becoming a computer networking specialist requires extensive knowledge of network management. In an entry-level capacity, computer networking specialists could be responsible for responding to troubleshooting calls and e-mails from users of the network. They'll need to be able to diagnose and offer repair instructions remotely, as well as in person. Program graduates are qualified for employment as networking specialists.

Diploma program length is fifty-four (54) credit hours.
